- Pre-K: We finished with Aiken Drum and started listening to Carnival of the Animals and reviewing our musical opposites!
- Kindergarten: We finished up learning about all our musical opposites and we reviewed them by listening and moving to “Carnival of the Animals.”
- First Grade: We experienced Vivaldi’s “Spring” by playing different instruments and we started our unit on Prokofiev’s “Peter and the Wolf.”
- Second Grade: We continued learning about sixteenth notes and learned about and created ostinato patterns that we shared with one another.
- Third Grade: We learned all about music symbols (and played fun games to practice them!) and we created and tried out ostinato patterns.
